To the Honorable the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the City and County of San Francisco

The petition of Alfred Bellier hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 845 Sutter St San Francisco, Cal.

Second. My occupation is Clerk

Third. I was born on the 17 day of Dec anno Domini 1870 at Neuchâtel Switzerland

Fourth. I migrated to the United States from France on or about the 15 day of March

anno Domini 1890 and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York

anno Domini 1890 on the vessel Shamshere on the 25 day of March

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 9 day of March anno Domini 1893

at San Francisco in the Court of State of California

Sixth. I am now married. My wife's name is Mary Anna She was born

in Virginia City, Nevada and now resides at 845 Sutter St San Francisco, Cal.

I have two children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Alfred Jr. born Sept 1 1901 at SAN FRANCISCO, CAL. Res. San Francisco Cal

Gyrome born May 26 1902 at SAN FRANCISCO, CAL. Res. San Francisco Cal

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to THE SWISS CONFEDERATION of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language. OTHER OWNED

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 25 day of March anno Domini 1890 and in the State of California, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 2 day of April anno Domini 1890, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Court of San Francisco on the 9 day of March anno Domini 1893 and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

Declaration of Intention and Certificate of Arrival No. 10734 from Department of Commerce and Labor filed this 27 day of AUGUST 1913
